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DIRECTOR'S NOTES

THE BENEFITS OF FARCE

Welcome to Michael Frayn's *Noises Off.* This mathematically precise and colourfully outlandish comedy exploded onto the London theatre scene in 1982, and has been continually produced around the world ever since. It is arguably one of the best examples of contemporary farce in English theatre. Mr. Frayn has continued to tinker with the script

over the years, and the result is a sharply detailed roadmap to chaos and calamity, which makes my job a heck of a lot easier.

The ancient Greeks, of course, were staging farces long before 1982, using buffoonish characters, physical gags, and scatological humour to lay comic waste to important personalities and institutions. We see elements of similarly broad comedy around the world, in the kyogen plays of fourteenth-century Japan, the clowns of Commedia dell'Arte, the high-energy films of Bollywood, and the modern TV sitcom. The Three Stooges, Three's Company, and The Three Sisters are all good examples of popular low comedy, in which the comic "rule of three" is a central theme.

Actually, *Three Sisters* is Chekhov. That's Russian realism. You can scratch that one. But you get the point: clearly, a well-executed pratfall, over time, maintains its value.

I note that the word "farce," apart from a dramatic context, has many negative associations in everyday use. According to Thesaurus.com, which is where I do most of my directorial research, "travesty," "sham," "mockery," and "total crap" are all synonyms. In drama, however, "farce" is defined as "comedy that depends on an elaborately contrived, usually improbable plot, broadly drawn stock characters, and physical humour." Sounds pretty fun to me.

Theatre provides an opportunity to unite an audience. With comedy, that potential for unification is especially potent. Laughing together, even with hundreds of total strangers, can strengthen our immune systems, boost our mood, diminish pain, and protect us from the damaging effects of stress. All good things. Laughter transcends language. It's contagious and primal. And let's face it: we live in difficult times. Human activity constantly threatens to pull us all apart in a hundred ways, through differences in politics, economics, and religion. Laughter allows us to set all that aside for a while. It relaxes us, and can provide the renewal we need to tackle the world. It's medicine!

Noises Off is a messy look at the backstage life of a hapless company of actors under a palpable amount of stress. Flubbed lines, missed entrances, petty jealousies, and deteriorating civility are all ready to be served up forn your viewing pleasure.

Enjoy the feast.
