We will be increasing social and artistic offerings as well as food and beverage services to create a more dynamic community space. What was once a weekend performance theatre will unfold as a day-to-day space for community to activate and engage with. This will be the year for more people to get involved and we look forward to your support!



AMAZING MOMENTS AND ARTISTIC ACHIEVEMENTS MASSEY THEATRE

Our stage was activated and bright with a presentation season that highlighted Canadian arts reflecting the diverse lenses and interests of the community. **MARTHA WAINWRIGHT, CHILLWACK, INTERNATIONAL GUITAR NIGHT** and **SHAUN MAJUMDER** delighted and captivated audiences with their music, comedy and charm. **ARTS CLUB THEATRE COMPANY'S NOISES OFF** marked the return of large-scale theatrical productions to the stage, remounting the Vancouver company's award winning hit, delighting audiences in the way only live theatre can do.

International stars **OLAFUR ARNALDS** and **BRUCE DICKINSON** had tour stops at Massey Theatre, highlighting our space as a regional draw and exceptional venue.

Past clients returned after years off due to COVID, new clients emerged and the community returned to the joy of live performances. And Eighth & Eight Creative Spaces began to take hold with new programs, emerging voices and access to space for artists, community members and more.

Our capacity has grown to compliment our space. Last year, we had 14 staff, now we have 22. We invested over ½ million dollars in the facility and nearly doubled our operations and programming budget. Our events increased from 174 to 260 and despite closures and gathering restrictions, 50,000 people came through the doors. As we grow, so do the opportunities.



AMAZING MOMENTS AND ARTISTIC ACHIEVEMENTS EIGHTH & EIGHT CREATIVE SPACES

With the signing of the 25-year partnership agreement with the new building owner -the City of New Westminster-the doors officially opened on Eighth & Eight Creative Spaces, the transitional name for the arts and community spaces surrounding the Massey Theatre. With over 37,000 square feet of dynamic and creative space available in which to create, share, and gather, we looked ahead to activation.

COMMUNITY NIGHTS launched providing artists, creators, activators and more the opportunity to access space, social and networking time between them for free. Artists were resourced to explore together in new and exciting ways in our **PERFORMING ARTS COLLABORATIVE CREATION RESIDENCY**. The aim was welcoming emerging artistic groups to the space to create, collaborate and perform. **ART CUBE, BENDING** and **LIVE WIRES** were presented publicly in one of our small spaces in development. **NEW WEST FAMILY PLACE** increased partnership with us in offering arts inspired toddler programs three times weekly in Studio 1C. **GLOBAL TEA SERIES** returned with the always enchanting Cassius Khan and his curated selection of global musicians. And finally, artistic collaborator Ryan Leslie Fisher ran **LOLGBT**, an empowering sketch comedy class for youth, where "every joke is a gay joke but the punchline isn't being gay".



AMAZING MOMENTS AND ARTISTIC ACHIEVEMENTS AT ANVIL THEATRE

As the audiences returned, the lights shone on Anvil Theatre activities. SHINE BRIGHT NEW WEST was elevated by a performance series in Anvil Theatre featuring THE KERPLUNKS, VITALY BECKMAN, KELLI HANES, AXE CAPOERIA, LOCARNO BAND, RUPLOOPS, TRILOGY and finishing off with the highlight of winter festivities in Anvil Centre, THE CEILIDH FEATURING BLACKTHORN.

VANCOUVER CHAMBER MUSIC once again brought their series of exceptional chamber music to Anvil Theatre with musicians from across the globe.

Anvil Theatre brought back **HEY VIOLA**, a remount of the initial premiere presentation that took place on the Anvil Theatre stage. And a group of theatre artists premiered the new **MOZART AND HER BROTHER**, exemplifying the commitment to present performances from underrepresented artists and groups.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying financial statements do not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Massey Theatre Society as at June 30, 2022, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.
